CONTACT INFORMATION

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HOUSE POLICIES

Personnel: A Spruce Peak Arts (SPA) staff member must be present in the theatre for any activity within the building.

Theatre Entrance: All artists and their personnel should enter through the stage door located at the south side of the theatre.

Backstage Access: Access is limited to authorized personnel of the artist and the staff of SPA. Any guests or visitors backstage must be approved by the Executive Director, Technical Director, or Director of Services prior to visitation.

Parking: All SPA staff, performers, and artistic personnel will need to park in the upper deck of the parking garage located south of the Arts Center. All parking restrictions will be conveyed to the artist during the advance. The driveway between the parking garage and the theater is for load-in and load-out only. Please contact the Technical Director or Director of Services to verify parking arrangements, as busy days at the resort can change the parking situation.

Marketing and Publicity: Placement of any posters, flyers, etc. in or around SPA is solely at the discretion of SPA management. The artist shall not affix any materials to the building directly. All marketing materials for the event must be approved by the Director of Communications and/or Executive Director and/or designated representative prior to distribution or general market release. Marketing and Publicity is encouraged, so please connect with marketing@sprucepeakarts.org or 802-585-3291.

Telephone and Internet: SPA provides high-speed internet connection via Wi-Fi throughout the facility. This may be restricted during performances that include live streaming.

Smoking: No smoking and/or vaping of any substance is permitted within the building of SPA. By Vermont Law, any smoking must be done at least 50' from any entrance. Please dispose of all butts responsibly.

Pyrotechnics: In accordance with Vermont fire codes, no open flame or pyrotechnics are permitted without the permission of the Fire Chief; this permission must be obtained no later than 2 weeks before the contracted event date. No internal combustion engines of any kind may be used at any time inside the facility. If your production utilizes pyrotechnics of any kind, please contact the Technical Director.

Food and Beverage: Outside food may not be brought into the theatre during any rehearsal, performance, or event without pre-approval. All backstage food and beverages must be coordinated through the Director of Services prior to the actual rental time in the facility.

House and Lobby Opening: The lobby is opened at least 1 hour prior to the scheduled time of the event, and the house is open to the patrons ½ hour prior to the scheduled time of the event. Any delay in the opening of the house, or the starting of the event, is done at the discretion of the Executive Director, Director of Services, and Technical Director.

Liquor: In accordance with the liquor license and the Vermont Department of Liquor Control, no unauthorized alcohol may be brought into the facility, no alcohol provided through concessions or hospitality may be removed from the building before, during, or after the event. Also, in accordance with the Vermont Department of Liquor control a bartender is required in the presence of any alcohol.

HOUSE POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Illegal Substances: Illegal drugs, controlled substances, and non-authorized alcoholic beverages are not permitted in or on the property at any time.

Security: Security is available at the request of the artist and must be contracted prior to arrival.

Stage: Bolting or fastening to the stage floor is expressly forbidden. Any attachments, including signage, to the stage walls must be reviewed with the Technical Director prior to approval.

Back Stage Support Areas: No taping, nailing, etc. in the dressing rooms, green room, or backstage walls are permitted.

House Curtains: Nothing may be affixed to any of the draperies or soft goods in the SPA.

Cables and Wiring: All cables and wiring for lights, sound, and effects must be run and taped securely along the floor, stage and house. Safety is under the discretion of the Technical Director.

Sound Check and Rehearsal: No audience is permitted at scheduled rehearsals or sound checks without prior approval of both artist and the Technical Director and/or Executive Director. In addition, SPA reserves the right to set the final volume levels for any sound in the facility.

Load-In Shoe Policy: During inclement weather, an "inside" and "outside" shoe policy will be put into effect to minimize the water and salt damage to the stage.

Cyclorama (CYC): Please take caution during load-in, load-out and other activities in the proximity of the CYC. It is a seamless piece of fabric (24' x 60') hanging upstage 4' from the back wall. It is awfully expensive and easily damaged. NEVER PLACE ANYTHING AGAINST THE CYC.

Strike/Load-Out: No on-stage strike may begin until the house is deemed "clear" by a member of the SPA staff. At the end of load out SPA staff and the visiting artists will do a joint walk through to make sure that all visiting inventory is loaded out and accounted for. Anything left in the building post event without prior approval of the Technical Director will be disposed of.

Dangerous Activity: If at any time the well-being of staff, patrons or equipment is threatened or jeopardized, it is within the power of the SPA staff to terminate these actions immediately.

MERCHANDISE

The selling of merchandise is established during the contract phase. If the artist chooses to sell merchandise, it will be sold in the Lobby of the SPA. Arrangements for tables, chairs, skirting, easels, power or related items can be made with the Director of Services.

The profit split of merchandise is an 80/20 split after Vermont State Tax if the performer chooses to have a member of the SPA Staff act as the Seller. If the artist provides his or her own Seller, the profit split of merchandise is 85/15, unless otherwise dictated by contract. House policy dictates that both a pre- and post- show count of inventory must take place; at the start of the event, and the closing of the lobby both the seller and SPA Staff must sign off on profit split and inventory.

Please note that there is no in-house credit card machine available for merchandise, and the acceptance of personal checks is done at the discretion of the artist.

Any inventory or material left behind after the load out of an event is subject to disposal. In addition, arrangements can be made to mail the remaining inventory at the artist's expense.

General Information

The SPA stage is an open proscenium, platform stage. Lighting positions are accessed via an overhead catwalk and tension grid system. The theater does not have a fly system. Stationary scenic elements can be installed below the grid with prior approval from the Technical Director.

Dressing Rooms and Green Room

The SPA has two dressing rooms (average capacity 10 & 12 adults) with lighted mirrors, chairs and clothing racks. Hangers, hand towels, and bath towels are provided. Two ironing boards, irons, and steamers are available for artist use.

Each room has WiFi, a sound system for monitoring the show in progress, and a 2 channel Clear-Com intercom system.

Located near the dressing rooms there are 3 restrooms; one of which has a private shower available for artist use.

The Green Room is furnished with armchairs, a couch, coffee table, microwave oven, and small refrigerator. Any items provided by hospitality will be located on tables in the Green Room, unless otherwise specified.

THEATER SPECIFICATIONS (CONTINUED)

Loading Access

Access to the theater is via a ramp from the driveway that leads to a double door, and single door, on the south side of the building. SPA does not have a loading dock.

Loading access to the stage is upstage left through a set of double doors, 8'-0" high by 6'-0" wide, which lead directly to the stage. There is a crossover upstage of the back wall, 6' wide (confirm usable width with Technical Director) and 10'-0" high.

Stage Deck/Marley

The stage deck is a sprung finished wood floor, finished in a flat ebony stain. Any bolting or fastening to the stage floor is expressly forbidden. For an additional fee, the stage floor can be completely covered with black Rosco Adagio Marley. The Marley spans the entire proscenium opening and from the downstage edge of the stage floor upstage to the cyclorama.

- We do not allow tapping on the bare stage floor.
- We do not allow the use of rosin anywhere on the stage or marley.
- We do not allow high heeled shoes on the marley.
- If set pieces are used be sure there are no exposed nails, screws, splinters, etc. that can damage the flooring.
- No food or drink is allowed in the cross-over to protect the equipment stored in this area.
- Instruments with an endpin must use a means to protect the stage floor.

Soft Goods

Masking is provided with dead-hung borders, two sets of black velour legs on tracks, and a full stage split black velour on a track. The full stage split blacks can serve either as masking legs or a full stage black backdrop. The legs and full stage split blacks can be tracked completely off to the stage walls. The legs' farthest onstage position is 20' off center stage. In addition, a white cyclorama located upstage is on a traveler and can be stored offstage right. There is a red velour main drape that covers the full width of the proscenium.

NOTE: If a production utilizes any equipment or props that cause smoke or haze, SPA will need to turn off the air handlers in the building. The use of these props are weather dependent and permission to use them will be decided day-of-show by the Technical Director.

Stage/Grid Work Lights

Over-stage work lights are a combination of fluorescent and incandescent fixtures that are controlled by two hard switches located stage right, and at the hatch located above the control booth.

House and Vestibule Lights

The house lights are controlled via two separate protocols: the Paradigm system, with control panels next to the lobby doors, green room door, and on the wall backstage left next to the sound rack; and the lighting console in the booth. The house lights use dimmers 166, 168-170. The vestibule lights are controlled by a remote switch located in the ushers closet.

Aisle and Knee-wall Lights

The aisle and knee-wall lights are in the house and around patron seating. The Vermont fire code states that these lights must remain on if a patron is present. These lights are controlled by two switches located on the house left wall in the control booth.

DIRECTIONS TO SPA

From the Boston, MA Area

Take I-93 Northbound. This is a partial toll road. Exit to I-89 North, entering Vermont. Take exit 10 (Waterbury/Stowe). Turn right onto VT-100 N. Turn left onto VT 108 N/Mountain Road at three-way stop. Follow VT 108 for approximately 8 miles, before turning right into the Spruce Peak complex. Take your first left onto Hourglass Drive and the Performing Arts Center is on your right.

From the New York, NY Area

Take I-95 Northbound. This is a partial toll road. After approximately 70 miles, take exit 48 to merge onto I-91 N, passing through Massachusetts and entering Vermont. Take exit 10N to merge onto I-89 N. Take exit 10 (Waterbury/Stowe). Turn right onto VT-100 N. Turn left onto VT 108 N/Mountain Road at three-way stop. Follow VT 108 for approximately 8 miles, before turning right into the Spruce Peak complex. Take your first left onto Hourglass Drive and the Performing Arts Center is on your right.

From the New Haven, CT Area

Take I-91 Northbound. Entering Vermont, take exit 10N to merge onto I-89N. Take exit 10 (Waterbury/Stowe). Turn right onto VT-100 N. Turn left onto VT 108 N/Mountain Road at three-way stop. Follow VT 108 for approximately 8 miles, before turning right into the Spruce Peak complex. Take your first left onto Hourglass Drive and the Performing Arts Center is on your right.

From the Montreal, QC, Canada Area

Take QC-133 Southbound, entering the United States and Vermont. Continue onto I-89 S. Take exit 10 (Waterbury/Stowe). Turn right onto VT-100 N. Turn left onto VT 108 N/Mountain Road at three-way stop. Follow VT 108 for approximately 8 miles, before turning right into the Spruce Peak complex. Take your first left onto Hourglass Drive and the Performing Arts Center is on your right.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Route 108 between Jeffersonville and Stowe is narrow, winding its way between huge boulders. It is only one lane wide in spots and it is closed in the winter. Large trucks and busses get stuck in "The Notch" on a regular basis. Do not take this road. If you find you are in Jeffersonville, take Route 15 to Route 100 in Morrisville. It is worth the extra 30 minutes to drive around the mountain.



FIGURE A: HOUSE SEATING CHART



FIGURE B: GROUND PLAN






FIGURE D: KEY TO FIGURE B AND C




FIGURE F: HOUSE PLOT
